Resolution Adopting The Jackson County Land Evaluation and Site Assessment as one of the Criteria for Land Development in Jackson County.

- WHEREAS: Federal and State funded project sites involving changes in agricultural land must be assessed for agricultural viability and site suitability under federal and state farmland protection policies, and
- WHEREAS: The United States Department of Agriculture has developed and the State of Illinois has adopted a system of Land Evaluation and Site Assessment for determining and rating agricultural values of land and assigning numerical rates to non-agricultural site factors, and
- WHEREAS: The Land Evaluation and Site Assessment System adopted by the State of Illinois is used in counties which have not developed their own local factor ratings, and
- WHEREAS: The Jackson County ad hoc Land Evaluation and Site Assessment Committee activated by and working with the Jackson County Board had developed a schedule of factors and rates for local use, and
- WHEREAS: The Jackson County Board has a need for guidelines for review and approval of subdivisions, and
- WHEREAS: The Jackson County Board has a need for guidelines in administering the Illinois Agricultural Areas Conservation and Protection Act, and
- WHEREAS: Uniform local guidelines are desirable for the Soil and Water Conservation District, real estate developers, project planners, planning commissions, Federal and State agencies, and others involved in agricultural land use conversions, or making environmental impact evaluations involving agricultural land, and
- WHEREAS: Federal and State regulations allow locally adopted LESA systems to take precedence over Federal and State LESA systems in evaluating federally and state funded projects.

Now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED that the document entitled Land Evaluation Site Assessment for Jackson County, Illinois; is hereby endorsed, approved and fully adopted by the Jackson County Board.

WHEREAS, the State's Attorney Appellate Service Commission was created to provide services to State's Attorneys in Judicial Districts containing⁽ⁿ⁾ less than 3,000,000 inhabitants; and,

WHEREAS, the powers and duties of the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission are defined and enumerated in the "State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission Act," Public Act 80-1, 1st Special Session Illinois Revised Statutes, 1977, Chapter 14, Section 201 et seq., approved December 3, 1977, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly appropriated monies for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission, one-third from the State's Attorney Appellate Service County Fund and two-thirds from the General Revenue Fund, provided that such funding receives county approval and support from within the respective Judicial Districts eligible to apply; and,

WHEREAS, the State's Attorney Appellate Service Commission shall administer the operation of the appellate offices so as to insure that all participating State's Attorneys continue to have final authority in preparation, filing and arguing of all appellate briefs and any trial assistance; and,

WHEREAS, the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission and the Illinois General Assembly have reviewed and approved a budget for Fiscal Year 1984, which funds will provide for the continued operation of the agency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jackson County Board, in regular session, this 11th day of January, 1984, does hereby support the continued operation of the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission, and designates the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission as its Agent to administer the operation of the appellate offices and process said appellate court cases for this County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attorneys employed by the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission are hereby authorized to act as Assistant State's Attorneys on behalf of the duly elected or appointed State's Attorney of this county in the appeal of criminal cases, juvenile cases, paternity cases, and cases arising under the Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Code when requested to do so by the State's Attorney, and by the advice and consent of the

State's Attorney prepare, file and argue appellate brief for these cases in the reviewing courts; and also, as may be requested, to assist the State's Attorney in the trial and appeal of tax objections.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Jackson County Board hereby agrees to participate in the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission for Fiscal Year 1984, commencing December 1, 1983, and ending November 30, 1984, by hereby appropriating a sum of money not to exceed \$9,200.00 for the express purpose of providing a portion of the funds required for financing the operation of the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission, and agrees to deliver same to the Commission on request during the 1984 Fiscal Year.

RESOLUTION # 84-4

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A LOAN
FOR JACKSON COUNTY AMBULANCE SERVICE

- WHEREAS, the Jackson County Ambulance Service is in need of a building to house ambulances and personnel in Carbondale, Illinois, and;
- WHEREAS, the Ambulance Service has insufficient money in its budget to pay for the entire amount necessary to build such a structure, and;
- WHEREAS, it is anticipated that there will be sufficient revenues from the service fees and taxes for the Ambulance service to pay for said building within a five year period, and;
- WHEREAS, the University Bank of Carbondale has agreed to loan the Jackson County Board \$100,000 at an interest rate of 8.25% annual percentage rate to be repaid in five years, and;
- WHEREAS, the aforementioned loan terms are believed to be advantageous to the Ambulance Service and to the taxpayers of Jackson County,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jackson County Board chairman is hereby authorized to receive on behalf of the Jackson County Board the sum of \$100,000 from the University Bank for immediate deposit with the Jackson County Treasurer in the Ambulance fund. The chairman is further authorized to execute as evidence of such indebtedness to the University Bank a note to the University Bank of Carbondale, Illinois in a principal amount of \$100,000 plus interest accumulating at 8.25% annual percentage rate, and providing for single annual payments commencing in 1985 and continuing for the next four years until the principal and interest as aforesaid are paid.

The Jackson County Treasurer is authorized to receive said money and place it into the Ambulance fund to be used exclusively for the purpose of acquiring facilities to house ambulances and ambulance personnel in Carbondale, Illinois.




