WHEREAS, it is expected that the department of Transportation will give its consent to the reappointment of William P. Munson,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE Jackson County Board that William P. Munson be, and he is hereby reappointed, Superintendent of Highways for Jackson County for a term of six years effective April 1, 1985 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Jackson County Board that the salary of the Superintendent of Highways be fixed at \$ 41,800.00 per year, effective April 1, 1985 through March 31, 1986 with a yearly increase of five percent (5%) of the salary in effect for the previous year.

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Administration makes available funds to economic development districts on a matching basis to establish Revolving Loan Funds; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Egypt Regional Planning and Development Commission has been designated as an Economic Development District by the Economic Development Administration since 1967; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois operates the Community Development Assistance Program from which these funds may be obtained to provide the local matching share.

1. 2. The Jackson County Board authorizes its Chairman to sign a joint agreement with other counties comprising the region to cooperate as needed to accomplish these improvements; and
3. That Williamson County is designated as the lead agency for this application and program and will be the applicant to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs; and
4. The Greater Egypt Regional Planning and Development Commission will be liable for all program administrative functions should the grant be awarded.

County Highway 8 beginning at the intersection of County Highway 8 and State Routes 13-127, a point near the Southeast corner of the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 16, Township 7 South, Range 2 West of the 3rd P.M. and extending in a westerly direction to an intersection with County Highway 2, a point near the Southwest corner of Section 13, Township 7 South, Range 3 West of the 3rd P.M. (A total addition of 3.80 miles).

County Highway 2 beginning at the intersection with County Highway 8, a point near the Southwest corner of Section 13, Township 7 South, Range 3 West of the 3rd P.M. and extending in a southerly direction to the intersection of State Route 4, a point near the Southwest corner of the Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 3 West of the 3rd P. M. (A total addition of 1.70 miles).


WHEREAS, the public welfare demands that repairs be made to structure #039-3013, Section 7B-00083-00-BR on County Highway B and;

AN ORDINANCE OF JACKSON COUNTY, ILLINOIS ASCERTAINING THE  
PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES FOR LABORERS, WORKERS AND MECHANICS  
EMPLOYED ON PUBLIC WORKS OF SAID COUNTY

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Section 39s-1 through 39s-12, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1973, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the County Board of Jackson County investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said county employed in performing construction of public works, for said county.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND THE JACKSON COUNTY BOARD:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the county is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Jackson County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June 1985 a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the county to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The County Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this county this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4: The County Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The County Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The County Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

**BUILDING AND HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION**

Jurisdiction in the Counties of Alexander, Callatin, Hamilton, Hardin, Jackson, Johnson, Massac, Pope, Pulaski, Saline, Union, White, Franklin & Williamson.

- Class 1. Operating Engineers: APSCO or Equal Spreading Machine, Backhoe, Backfiller, Boom or Winch Cat, Bituminous Mixplane Machine, Blacksmith, Bituminous Surfacing Machine, Bull-Dozer, Crane, Shovel, Dragline, Truck Crane, Pile Driver, Concrete Breaker, Concrete or Pumpcrete Pumps, Dinky or Standard Locomotives, Well or Caisson Drills, Elevating Grader, Fork Lifts, Flexplane, Gradeall, Hi-Lift, Hoists, Guy-Derricks, Hyater, Mechanic Motor Patrol, Mixers-21 cu. ft. or over, Push Cats, Pulls and Scrapers, Two Well Point pumps, Pulverizer or Tiller, PugMill, Rubber-Tired Farm Type Tractor with Bulldozer/Blade/Auger or hi-lift over  $\frac{1}{2}$  yd., Jersey Spreader, Tract-Air used with Drill or Hi-Lift, Trenching or Ditching machines, Wood Chipper W/Tractor, Self-Propelled Roller W/Blade, Equipment Greaser, Self-Propelled Bump Grinder on Concrete Highway pavement, concrete finishing machine or Spreader Machine.**
- Class 2. Air Compressor W/Valve driving piling, Two Air Compressors (220 cu. ft. capacity or over), Two AirTract Drills, Air-Track Drill W/Compressor, Automatic Bins or Scales W/Compressor or Generator, Pipeline Boring Machine, Bulk Cement Plant W/Separate Compressor, Power Operated Bull Float, Hydra-Lift W/Single Motor, Straw Mulcher Blower W/Spout, Self-Propelled Roller/Compactor, Back-End man on Bituminous Surfacing Machine.**

Mortar Mixer W/Skip or Pump, Pipeline Tract Jack. One Operating Engineer may operate and maintain any combination of the following pieces of equipment, not to exceed four (4) which shall be within a reasonable distance, such combination may include any equipment in this classification: (Compressors, Light Plants, Generators, Welding Machines, Pumps or Conveyors).**

**One Well-Point Pump, Two Motor Driven Heaters.**

Class 5. One Air Compressor (under 220 cu. ft.), One Conveyor, One Motor Driven Heater, One Light Plant, One Pump, One Welding Machine, One Umac or Equal Spreader, Conveyor Operator on Self-Propelled Chip Spreader. Oilers.

TRUCK DRIVERS -- CLASSIFICATION OF EQUIPMENT - BUILDING, HEAVY & HIGHWAY WORK

Jurisdiction in the following Counties of Illinois:

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehousemen, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling material, tools, or men to and from and on the job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, and four axle combination units.

In the event the Employer desires to use ticket writers that classification shall come under Class 2.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, mechanics and working foremen.

Five axle or more combination units.

In the event the Employer desires to use dispatchers that classification shall come under Class 3.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.





RESOLUTION FOR A LOAN TO THE PUBLIC BUILDING COMMISSION

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the County Board of Jackson County, Illinois, that there is a need for and that it is in the best interest of the public that a new county jail facility be constructed; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Jackson County, Illinois, has resolved in Resolution No. 84-25 approved and adopted on July 11, 1984, to construct a new county jail facility; and

Whereas, the Public Building Commission of Jackson County, Illinois, has been created for the acquisition, construction, and enlargement of public improvements, buildings, and facilities for use by governmental agencies in the furnishing of essential governmental, health, safety and welfare services to the citizens of Jackson County, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Public Building Commission has entered into an agreement to acquire for use as the location of the jail facility the following site:

PARCEL 1:

The West Half of Block 22 in the Original Town of Murphysboro, Illinois.

PARCEL 2:

Part of Lot 2 in the subdivision of Out Lot 14 and all of Lot 3 and part of Lot 2 in the subdivision of Out Lot 15 in the City of Murphysboro, Illinois, described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the center of South Eleventh Street in said City; thence running East along the North line of Out Lot 14 and Out Lot 15, a distance of 89 feet 3 inches; thence South 148½ feet to the South line of Out Lot 15; thence West along the South Line of Out Lot 15, a distance of 89 feet 3 inches; thence South to the branch; thence in a Northwesterly direction along said branch to the intersection of the East line of Lot 6 in Block 23 in the Original Town of Murphysboro extended South; thence North along said East line of Lot 6 extended South to the North line of Out Lot 14; thence East along the North line of Out Lot 14, a distance of 30 feet to the point of beginning.




NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE JACKSON COUNTY BOARD AS FOLLOWS:



WHEREAS, the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission was created to provide services to State's Attorneys in Judicial Districts containing less than 3,000,000 inhabitants; and,

WHEREAS, the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission shall administer the operation of the appellate offices so as to insure that all participating State's Attorneys continue to have final authority in preparation, filing and arguing of all appellate briefs and any trial assistance; and,

WHEREAS, the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission and the Illinois General Assembly have reviewed and approved a budget for Fiscal Year 1986, which funds will provide for the continued operation of the agency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jackson County Board, in regular session, this 11th day of DEC., 1985, does hereby support the continued operation of the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission, and designates the State's Attorneys Appellate Service Commission as its Agent to administer the operation of the appellate offices and process said appellate court cases for this County.

RESOLUTION FOR A LOAN TO THE JACKSON COUNTY  
PUBLIC BUILDING COMMISSION

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the County Board of Jackson County, Illinois, that there is a need for and that it is in the best interest of the public that a new county jail facility be constructed; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Jackson County, Illinois, has resolved in Resolution No. 84-25 approved and adopted on July 11, 1984, to construct a new county jail facility; and

WHEREAS, the Public Building Commission of Jackson County, Illinois, has been created for the acquisition, construction, and enlargement of public improvements, buildings, and facilities for use by governmental agencies in the furnishing of essential governmental, health, safety and welfare services to the citizens of Jackson County, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Public Building Commission has incurred some preliminary expenses in the acquisition of land and the construction of the new county jail and is unable at this time to pay such expenses; and

WHEREAS, there exists within the budget for Fiscal Year 1986, in the Federal Revenue Sharing Contingency Fund, sufficient funds to lend to the Jackson County Public Building Commission for the purpose of paying these preliminary expenses.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE JACKSON COUNTY BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Public Building Commission of Jackson County, Illinois, is authorized to borrow from the Jackson County Board the sum of \$15,000, said sum to come from the Federal Revenue Sharing Contingency Fund of the Jackson County Budget for Fiscal Year 1986.
2. That the Public Building Commission of Jackson County, Illinois, is to pay to the Jackson County Board the amount of \$15,000 upon the issuance of the bonds as set forth above, but in no case later than November 30, 1986. Such amount shall be paid with no interest.
3. That the Treasurer of Jackson County, Illinois is authorized to disburse funds in accordance with the terms of this Resolution.

4. That the funds loaned pursuant to this Resolution shall be used only for purposes of paying such preliminary expenses.
