WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the State of Illinois has authorized and empowered counties to enact reasonable regulations regarding the subdivision of land and to provide for the administration, enforcement and amendment of such regulations, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Jackson County deems it in the interests of the health, safety and convenience of the people of said county to enact such regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Jackson County, Illinois, duly assembled according to law, as follows:

Short Title

I. This Resolution may be known and cited as the Jackson County Subdivision Regulations.

Definitions

II. As used in these Regulations:

1. 'Subdivision' means the division of a parcel of land into four (4) or more lots or parcels for the purpose of transfer of ownership or building developments or, if the opening or construction of a new street intended for use by the public is involved, any division of a parcel of land. The division or redivision of a parcel of land within a period of five (5) years from an initial division into four (4) or more such lots or parcels shall be deemed a subdivision. *x year*
2. 'Subdivider' means the record or actual owner or developer of real estate or applicant seeking approval of a subdivision.
3. Any division of a parcel of land into three (3) or fewer lots or parcels shall comply with all State laws and County ordinances including, but not limited to, platting, sewage disposal and water supply.

Procedure

III. Before any subdivision as defined above may become effective, the following procedure shall be followed by a subdivider:

1. An application shall be filed with the County Clerk of Jackson County requiring approval by the Board of Supervisors of said County of the proposed subdivision.
2. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) plus One Dollar (\$1.00) for each lot, sub-lot or tract of land shown on such map or plat of the proposed subdivision.
3. The subdivider shall submit at least six (6) copies of a map or plat of the land proposed to be subdivided to the Planning and Zoning Committee of the Board of Supervisors, to be distributed as follows: County Clerk, Supervisor of Assessments, Township Assessor, Township Road Commissioner, Health Department and County Superintendent of Highways.
4. The map or plat shall include, but is not limited to, (a) geographic location and (b) topographical details of the proposed subdivision.
5. All proposed subdivision shall be submitted to (a) the Jackson County Health Department, (b) Township Road Commissioner and (c) the Superintendent of Highways of said county for approval prior to being presented to the Planning and Zoning Committee. ✓
6. The Planning and Zoning Committee shall review each application to determine whether or not it is in the best interest of the People of the County of Jackson to permit the establishment of each proposed subdivision. ✓
7. After reviewing the application for the proposed subdivision, the Planning and Zoning Committee shall submit to the Board of Supervisors of Jackson County the proposed subdivision along with said Committee's recommendation as to whether or not the application shall be approved or denied.

8. No application shall be approved unless the proposed subdivision meets the minimum requirements concerning roads and streets as established by the Township Highway Commissioner, County Superintendent of Highways and of sewage and waste disposal as established by the said County Board of Supervisors and administered by the said County Health Department.

IV. PENALTIES

Any subdivider as defined herein who subdivides land without obtaining prior approval as provided herein, shall be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense. Each lot, sub-lot or tract shall be considered a separate offense.

Any subdivider who fails to comply with the conditions of his permit after having obtained approval from the said County Board of Supervisors, shall be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense. Each day of non-compliance with the provisions of said permit shall be considered a separate offense.

V. This Resolution and all rules and regulations subsequently enacted concerning the enforcement of this Resolution shall be enforced by the County Health Department, the County Superintendent of Highways and by the Board of Supervisors of said County.

VI. This Resolution shall become effective as of the date of its approval.

VII. All Ordinances, parts of Ordinances, Resolutions or parts of Resolutions in conflict with this Resolution, or inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution,

including the "Subdivision Regulations, County of Jackson, Illinois" adopted August 9, 1957, are hereby repealed and rescinded.

VIII. Should any section or sections of this Resolution be declared unconstitutional, all other sections therein shall remain in full force and effect as a Resolution of said County Board of Supervisors of Jackson County, Illinois.

2. The sum of \$1,436,456. is hereby levied upon all taxable property in Jackson County, Illinois, as equalized as assessed by the Department of Local Government Affairs, for the purpose of meeting and defraying the necessary expenses and liabilities as hereinafter set forth:

- a. the sum of \$307,000 is levied for the County's payment and contribution to the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund;
- b. the sum of \$13,500 is levied for the Civil Defense;
- c. the sum of \$170,000 is levied for the County's payment to the Public Building Commission for the leasing of the facilities for the Jackson County Nursing Home;
- d. the sum of \$168,000 is levied for Public Health purposes;
- e. the sum of \$63,795 is levied for the purpose of treating and caring for those affected with Tuberculosis;
- f. the sum of \$190,000 is levied for the operation of the Community Mental Health Board;
- g. the sum of \$190,000 is levied for corporate general purposes;

h. the sum of \$19,000 is levied for the purpose of paying the expenses of elections;

i. the sum of \$47,500 is levied for the purpose of preparing, establishing, and maintaining a detailed property record card system;

j. the sum of \$38,000 is levied for the purpose of assisting in paying the continuing expenses of the office of the Supervisor of Assessments;

k. the sum of \$193,661 is levied for the purpose of the Jackson County Ambulance program;

l. the sum of \$36,000 is levied for the County's payment and contribution to the Social Security System.

3. The taxes levied by and to be collected pursuant to this Resolution shall be expended, more specifically, for the purposes set forth in the itemized budget attached hereto as Exhibit A, and made a part of this Resolution by this reference as if the same were fully set forth herein.
