

## ORDINANCE NO. 2020-03

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE LIQUOR CONTROL ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, in response to the outbreak of COVID-19, the Illinois Liquor Control Commission [the “Commission”] issued an order addressing the Temporary Delivery of Alcoholic Liquor, in order to promote social distancing; and,

WHEREAS, in response to the outbreak of COVID-19, the State of Illinois has declared all counties in the State a disaster area, by Executive Order of the Governor, dated March 20, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson County Liquor Advisory Board has considered the Commission’s proposal and has recommended that the Jackson County Board consider the implementation of the Commission’s temporary regulations in Jackson County.

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jackson County Liquor Control Ordinance, Article 6 [Regulation of Operations], is hereby amended to add Section 8 [Delivery of Alcoholic Beverages], authorizing delivery of alcoholic beverages for a temporary period, as follows:

#### Section 8. Delivery of Alcoholic Beverages.

- a. All Licensees shall be authorized to conduct packaged sales, “to go” sales, curbside deliveries, home residential deliveries, and any other sale or delivery intended to promote social distancing (“Temporary Deliveries”).
- b. All alcoholic beverages must be in Original Packaging (as defined by Paragraph N of Article I, Section 2); sales of beer by Microbreweries shall comply with 235 ILCS 5/6-6.5 (using sealed growlers/crowlers).
- c. No consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted on the premises of the Licensee.
- d. Licensees may not conduct Temporary Deliveries of any alcoholic liquor they are not normally authorized to sell to non-licensees.
- e. Licensees are not authorized to sell or deliver pre-mixed cocktails normally intended for on-premises consumption (e.g. pre-mix margaritas, sangrias).
- f. Temporary Deliveries are only allowed by employees of Licensees; Licensees may not use third-party delivery services to make Temporary Deliveries.
- g. All Temporary Deliveries shall require the delivery representative to observe the appearance of the delivery recipient at a safe social distance and, if necessary, require the examination of the recipient’s identification to ensure the recipient is over twenty-one years of age. If such observation of the recipient or recipient’s identification cannot be accomplished while respecting safe social distancing, the alcoholic liquor shall be returned to the Licensee’s premises, and the prospective purchaser provided with a full refund.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,


That the temporary authorization of deliveries contained herein is intended to be in compliance with the March 19, 2020, COVID-19 order issued by the Illinois Liquor Control Commission related to temporary alcoholic liquor deliveries.

That alcoholic liquor deliveries made under the conditions set forth herein are temporary, with a sunset provision of ninety (90) days following approval of this Board, subject to extension not exceeding 90 days without prior approval of the Board, at the discretion of the Liquor Control Commissioner, provided that the Commission has not rescinded its March 19, 2020, order.
